Innovative Process for homegrown harmonized standards (key principles)



▶ Challenging to get a "compliant" assessment outcome

"Innovative process" designed and approved

▶Goal: improve the timely delivery of compliant harmonized

Standards






Innovative process based on 2 main pillars:

- Mature draft concept
 - ► Draft ready for ENQ
 - ► Mature draft assessment **mandatory**
 - ▶ Optional FWD assessment **not possible** anymore (while FWD circulation still possible)
- CCMC Quality Check
 - ▶ help Technical Bodies identify elements in the draft, or the related Annexes, that could potentially lead to a lack of compliance assessment
 - ▶ Uses Common checklist as support document
 - ► Replaces "Harmonized Standards checklist"




Homegrown candidate hEN for citation



Process






- ► Anticipate WG meetings before requesting CCMC QC/HAS assessment
- ▶TB to prepare Annexes early, in // with draft development
- ▶TB shall send filled-in Common Checklist, draft and Annexes to CCMC for QC

When to request an assessment





- Maximum <u>4 assessments</u> per WI
- LCA: full assessment, should become exceptional
- Not possible to request assessments of published standards

Formal agreement on technical cooperation between ISO and CEN


When?

Why?


- Avoid duplication of work at International & European levels

 Agreement on common planning of new work and parallel voting between IEC and CENELEC


When?

- Ensure rational use of back office resources



Key factors for the International Standardization process:


- ► Consensus-Building at European and International level
- ► Strong Communication and Coordination between the European TC and the International TC (specific role for secretaries, convenors and TPM)

For Harmonized ENs

The same Standard applies Worldwide and provides presumption of conformity to the European Legislation

Parallel Projects Process





'New' Process for Parallel Projects (hENs)



Process intended to:

- ▶ <u>Improve</u> timely delivery for parallel ISO/IEC Harmonized Standards
- ► Avoid blocked draft Standards before Publication
- ► <u>Minimize</u> interference with International Projects timeframe


'New' Process for Parallel Projects (hENs)



- ► <u>Early awareness</u> of candidate Harmonized Standards at ISO/IEC.
- ▶ At the start of the <u>CD consultation</u> (if any), ISO and IEC secretariats circulate the <u>Committee Draft</u> (CD) to CCMC.
- ▶ CD CCMC Quality Check on European Elements, if certain conditions are met.
- ▶ <u>Mandatory CD HAS Assessment</u>, if certain conditions are met.
- ► <u>HAS Assessment Report</u> officially transmitted to International TCs
- → 'New Process' (hENs) only impacts CD stage


'New' Process for Parallel Projects (hENs)

ISO

CCMC CD Quality Check on EU Elements only performed when:

- ✓ Elements are provided by CEN/TC
- ✓ EU Elements are **not** included in ISO CD text
- ✓ CD consultation is <u>above 8 weeks</u>

ISO CD without Annex ZA included:

<u>CCMC CD Quality Check</u> on EU Elements <u>only</u> performed when:

- ✓ Elements are provided by CLC/TC
- ✓ CD consultation is <u>above 8 weeks</u>





Summarized process for **IEC**:

CLC/TC to provide Annexes ZA and ZZ as soon as CD is available

Key points



► Start the process as early as possible

► European TC invited to closely follow work at international level and to develop Annex Z in parallel with CD draft

- ▶ 'New' Process will only apply if:
 - ▶ CD available
 - ► European Elements available
- **▶**Communication is key
 - ► Ensure communication flows between CEN/TC, CLC/TC (interaction with the HAS consultants) and ISO/TC, IEC/TC (writing the standard)
- ► <u>Common checklist</u> not mandatory, but highly recommended when drafting European Annexes

Main reasons for Lack of Compliance (status: November 2024)



Non-Compliance Data – Top 10 Reasons for Non-Compliance (status: 12/11/2024)

B- 1.2.22	The Annex Z properly relates the relevant legal requirements of EU legislation to the clauses or sub-clauses of the document.	358	44%
B- 1.2.17	The tests and/or assessment methods are reproducible and appropriate and they can be applied to demonstrate compliance with the legal requirements in an objectively verifiable manner the technical specifications in support of the legal requirements	221	27%
B- 1.2.14	The normative part of the document is written in a clear way so users will know which specification applies to address EU legal requirements and there is no room for arbitrary choices.	205	25%
B- 1.2.8	All the normative references are available at the time of the assessment.	197	24%

Quality Check Procedure



- ▶Quality Check only performed at:
 - Mature Draft stage
 - Pre-Formal Vote stage

► NEW Common Checklist for Harmonized Standards is the basis of the CCMC Quality Check

►Only Criteria linked to IR3, Normative References and Annex ZA/ZZ are checked

New EC-ESOs Common Checklist



▶Goal:

- > support Technical Bodies in drafting hEN
- > Increase HAS assessment 'Compliant'
- > Have a common checklist used by ESOs and EC/HAS
- >TBs will use same document as HAS consultants
- ► Mandatory for homegrown draft hEN as of October 2023
- Strongly recommended for drafting of hEN under VA and FA (with ISO or IEC lead)
- ►CEN BOSS CENELEC BOSS

A-deviation in hEN

The A-deviation system



Attention should be paid to those cases where the national regulation in question conflicts with EU harmonization legislation. It is not in the remit of CEN and CENELEC to assess and decide if the national regulation is in conflict or not with the EU/EEA harmonization legislation.

NOTE:

- > For EEA countries it is expected that there is no conflict between the National regulation and the EU/EEA harmonisation legislation.
- > For non-EEA countries having an agreement with the EU and demonstrating regulatory convergence or compatibility with the essential regulations that support the Single market in areas that are relevant to CEN and CENELEC activities, conflict between their national regulation and EU/EEA harmonisation legislation is expected to be limited given the link between those countries and EU/EEA.

For standards intended to be offered for citation in OJEU, Technical bodies (or SRs) should make every effort to draft the EN/HD in such a way that A-deviations are not needed for those clauses related to the fulfilment of essential requirements of the European legislation
