EC 'CHECK POINT'



'verification document' Ares(2016)6548298 - 22/11/2016

 The standard contains provisions which unfairly privilege one economic operator or a group of economic operators by not being technically neutral enough (e.g. IPRs are included or a specification arbitrarily matches the products of one/a few manufacturers only).

EC-EY Checklist

4.1 (i) A requirement, provision or piece of guidance is addressed to 'economic operators', (ii) the 'neutrality principle' is not respected, OR (iii) a requirement, provision or piece of guidance addresses inappropriate conditions for placing on the market (or service provision)

What does this mean?

- ▲ Avoid to create conditions for unfair competition
- Technological Neutral & Performance based
- ▲ Neutrality principle
- Conformity assessment guidance to be followed
- ▲ Attention not to discriminate SME's

Each individual product shall comply to the legislation









- ▲ Statistical methods such as 80-80 rules (EMC standardization)
- ▲ Instructions on WHO has to perform a test
 - ▲ This should not be addressed in a standard
 - ▲ Legal 'conformity assessment modules' may exist

EC 'CHECK POINT'

The standard claims to cover a certain legal requirement while giving the economic operator a choice that is not provided for by the legislator and thus suggesting that it is permissible to circumvent the requirement.

EC-EY Checklist

4.5 Contains a non-specific or non-verifiable requirement, provision or piece of guidance, leaving it to a manufacturer or another standard user to decide how to apply

What does this mean?



Tests need to be defined in order to ensure that the specifications are correctly and coherently applied and met

Tests shall not contain clauses allowing manufacturers to determine (or deviate from agreed) requirements

EXAMPLES



[...] During and after the test, the apparatus shall continue to operate as intended. No degradation of performance or loss of function is allowed below a permissible **performance level specified by the manufacturer** when the apparatus is used as intended. [...]

[...] the manufacturer shall declare, for inclusion in the test report, **his own specification for an acceptable level of performance or degradation of performance** during and/or after the immunity tests[...]
