

Addressing legal issues in the standards development process

- Invention that is novel, inventive, have industrial applicability and is lawful
- » Exclusive right, limited in time
- Protection for 20 years from the filing date
- Patents vs Trade Secrets?





Copyright

- Protects original and tangible artistic, dramatic, literary, musical work, etc.
- » No registration required
- Lasts for the lifetime of the author
 + 70 years after his death







Trademarks

- Identifies and distinguishes the source of origin
- Monopoly right, exclusive right
- Can be registered for a period of 10 years, and renewed indefinitely

Establishing the copyright claim

 Transferring copyright exploitation rights

CEN and CENELEC copyright policies

- <u>CEN-CENELEC Guide 10</u> common Copyright policy
- Copyright is owned by CEN and CENELEC
- NSBs and NCs enjoy the exclusive exploitation right on CEN and CENELEC publications in their countries
- CEN-CENELEC Joint Commercial Advisory Group (JCAG)





Experts' assignment of exploitation rights to CEN and/or CENELEC

- An expert contributing in a TC or WG must transfer to CEN and/or CENELEC the copyright on the contents she/he produces
- CEN and CENELEC: "ASSIGNMENT OF RIGHTS STATEMENT" signed at every meeting
- However, experts still enjoy moral rights to their personal identifiable contributions





Experts' assignment of exploitation rights to CEN and/or CENELEC

Make sure that everyone has signed the <u>attendance list</u> and <u>statement</u> at every meeting!





Addressing legal issues in the standards development process

Licencing of content from other individuals or organisations

When the individual is not (permanent) participant in a TC - has not signed the Exploitation Rights Statement

OR

> TC wishes to use content owned by another individual or organisation





Licencing of content from other individuals or organisations

> Ensure: EXPLOITATION RIGHTS LICENSE AGREEMENT (ERLA) > How?

- 1. Contact IPR owner to fill in the ERLA
- 2. Verify with CCMC (PM responsible) to ensure ERLA is completed with the necessary information
- Request from IPR owner to sign and send (post and email) the ERLA to CCMC



Standards and patent rights

Patents and the technical work: what to do?

- > Early disclosure is recommended
- Chairs/Convenors ask at every meeting request is recorded in the minutes
- > Anyone can flag possible Standard Essential Patents (SEPs)
- > Technical group does not determine if essential, scope or validity of patent, but can discuss about its relevance
- If patent owner is not willing to licence consider how to address technical conflict in the standard





Standards and patent rights

Patents and the technical work: what to do?

- > Ask patent owner to fill in the <u>Declaration Form</u> in Annex 2 to Guide 8
- > Verify with CCMC (PM responsible) to ensure Declaration is completed well and contains all the necessary information
- Ensure that the patent owner has signed and sent (post and email) the Declaration to CCMC


Competition law principles in CEN-CENELEC technical work

- <u>CEN-CENELEC Guide 31</u>: Competition law for participants in CEN-CENELEC activities
- > Aim is to ensure neutrality and wide participation
- >All forms of anti-competitive behaviour are prohibited by law, even when they are unintentional
- Follow the list of DOs and DONTs in Guide 31
- In case of doubt contact your legal advisor or CCMC





CEN-CENELEC Data Protection Compliance System



CEN-CENELEC Data Protection Compliance System

- Implementation measures already in place for databases online tools and website: Data Protection and Privacy Statement, consent box and cookies policy
- Draft CEN-CENELEC Guide 37 on common policy for data protection will be soon approved and published
- Standard Contractual Clauses signed with ISO and IEC adjusted to controller/controller relationship to reflect flux of data and responsibilities
- Data processing contracts signed with service providers e.g. online meetings (for example ZOOM)
- Dedicated trainings will be offered
- Data Protection Contact Person
