



Standards & Trade Unions

The relevance of standards for trade unions is multifaceted:

The scope of standardization has extended beyond product safety, performance, and interoperability.

It now affects a wide range of issues such as occupational health and safety management, competences and training, service provision and privacy at work.

Standards increasingly impact the organisation of production and working conditions.

ETUC STANDardisation project

Although the European Standardization System (ESS) is open to the participation of all stakeholders, it is largely dominated by industry.

The ETUC has been chosen to represent social stakeholders (i.e. workers) in the ESS.

In 2015, the ETUC launched the ETUC STANDardisation project.

- 2,4 FTE at ETUC Secretariat to oversee the execution of the project;
- ETUC Special Committee 'Standardisation':
 - ✓ Consists of delegates of the ETUC affiliates & European Trade Unions Federations.
 - ✓ Meets twice a year & is consulted on important issues regarding standardisation.







ETUC mission

► Facilitate and strengthen the participation of trade unions in standardization activities.

<u>Note</u>: ETUI also coordinates standardisation activities, mainly on machinery & PPE linked work,

- Influence the standard content to:
 - ✓ Include high quality working conditions;
 - ✓ Avoid that standardization initiatives encroach upon national labour laws, collective agreements and collective bargaining;
- Serve as a competence centre on standardization for trade unions, bringing support and advice to trade union experts.
- Training and raising awareness activities for trade union experts.






The Opinion mechanism (Societal Stakeholders)

- Right to submit an Opinion at:
 - Enquiry
 - Formal Vote
- Opinion is expected to be:
 - Used positively
 - Used when participating
 - Constructive for TC to take on board
- Opinion is not part of the ballot:
 - Outcome vote: not affected
 - National delegation principle: not affected











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The Opinion mechanism (Societal Stakeholders)

- 1. SSOs \rightarrow CCMC
- CCMC → TC Secretary & Chair
- TC Secretary uploads it on the eCommittees tool (CEN) or Collaboration Tool (CENELEC)
- TC Secretary **informs** the TC for consideration
 - together with all submitted comments (ENQ)
 - ➤ At first occasion (most likely next meeting) (Formal Vote)
- TC agrees on the follow up → CCMC

→ CEN BOSS; CENELEC BOSS















Testimonial from ETUC expert: Ornella CILONA'

- Represented the ETUC in the CEN/TC 447 'Horizontal standards for the provision of services', set up in 2016.
- Mainly participated in the WG 4, aimed at providing the guidelines for "the assessment of the capacity of service providers and the evaluation of service proposals", in the framework of procurement.

Two main reasons for ETUC participation:

- to improve working conditions in the supply chain;
- to include references to collective bargaining and social rights into the standard.







ETUC main contributions to FprEN 17371-1

▶ The standard on Service Procurement (FprEN 17371-1) under development (ENQ in 2019). It refers to ISO 26000 (now adopted as a CEN standard) on "Social responsibility", a standard written with the active contribution of stakeholders from all over the world.

FprEN 17371-1 contains an annex – shaped by **ETUC** and ANEC – which lists accessibility and sustainability criteria related to evaluate "best value" in private procurement.













ETUC main contributions to FprEN 17371-1

The standard also addresses issues such as:

- Provision for an up-to-date certificate on social security contributions for salaried employees and self-employed persons;
- Human resources, focusing on both quality and quantity of personnel, posted workers and subcontractors;
- ► Possible submission of a document on the policy of collective agreements at the place of work;
- ➤ Violation of the International Labour Organization's Fundamental labour rights.







Lessons learnt

LESSON 1

Trade Unions' representatives and CEN-CENELEC technical body officers can learn a lot from eachother's experiences and opinions.

LESSON 2

The role of Annex III organizations opens up new perspectives in standardization, for both content and method.

LESSON 3

The consensus principle is a crucial one in standardization. It requires openness, transparency and dialogue.
