
- ➤ My Profile: CEN and/or CENELEC (can be changed)

Combination of several search criteria and the saving of your complex searches > Save your Search
















 - Full name and role (e.g. Els Somers, Secretary of CLC/TC123/WG01)
 - Meeting title (e.g. CLC/TC123/WG01 preparation meeting Brussels)
 - Organization + Technical Body involved (CEN, CENELEC, NSB/NC, ...)
 - CEN, CENELEC, or joint CEN-CENELEC meeting
 - Web meeting date, including begin & end time
 - Number of participants
- A new request is necessary for each web meeting

Standards in XML format (1)

Background

- CCMC obliged to provide XML for 100% applicable deliverables
 - Word (.doc/.docx), PDF and XML
- Members and translators use XML more and more
- Members highly value standards in XML format
 - Flexibility of use
 - Commercial opportunities
 - Ease of translation











Standards in XML format (2)


- What is XML?
 - XML = eXtensible Markup Language
 - Code file carries data:

Standards in XML format (3)

Impact on Drafting

- First version of standard? → Simple templates on BOSS
- Revision of standard? → Use CCMC version
 - No access to CCMC version? Write to MailProduction and ask!
- Rejection of text if elements are poor quality/missing
- XML sometimes not possible, for example large documents





Standards in XML format (4)

Tips for drafting with XML in mind

- Tables
 - Keep them short and simple
 - Avoid merging and splitting cells
 - No nested tables
 - Black text only white text will not appear in XML
 - Avoid tabs for alignment use aligner arrows on ruler
- Figures
 - .tiff/.eps ONLY
 - 600dpi, compression LZW, size 100%
 - One file for each figure, INCLUDING key symbols, figures in tables, etc.
 - Missing files = rejected text





Standards in XML format (5)

- Tips for drafting with XML in mind
 - Formulae/Equations
 - DO NOT lay out in tables!
 - MathType OR Word Equation tool OR body text (No images)
 - Only where necessary (if it can be plain text, use plain text!)
 - References to standards/clauses of standards
 - EN 1234-5:2020 OR CEN/CLC/TR 1234:2020
 - EN 1234-5:2020, 6,1/Table 2/figure 3

NOT:

- X clause 6.1 of EN 1234
- X Figure 3 of TR 1234
